A copy of the previous minutes was given to each member of the board and after reviewing; motion to approve as distributed was made by Lansing and seconded by Wheeler.

Vote YES – Humble, Lansing, Wheeler

Robert Stigall, Engineer for the new Waste Water Plant addressed the board with an update on the project and Engineering agreements to be approved.

Motion was made by Lansing and seconded by Humble to approve engineering contract services with Hussey Gay Bell-Nashville.

Brian Turner, Parks and Recreation Committee Member addressed the board requesting the city to write a letter of intent to approve to apply for a 50/50 grant with TDEC to update the BCYB ballpark lights to led and to upgrade the bathrooms to ADA compliance along with some other things that need fixed or replaced.

Motion was made by Wheeler and seconded by Humble on the BCYB request.

Motion to approve moving \$1,260.59 of utility debt from active status to inactive status for collection and also approve the utility adjustments was made by Lansing and seconded by Wheeler.

Mayor Cagle presented the paving bids for paving from Standefer Drug Center to the Pikeville Vol. Fire Dept. on Main Street:

1. Rogers Group - \$98,600
2. Thomas Brothers - \$155,000

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CYBER SECURITY MATCHING GRANT THROUGH PUBLIC ENTITY PARTNERS

Motion was made by Lansing and seconded by Humble to approve the above said resolution.

The mayor informed the board that the county had initially received a \$95,000 Tourism and Hospitality Recovery (ARP) Grant. However they would like to pass it to the city to be used in conjunction with the chamber. The 1yr can spend \$30,083, 2nd yr. \$19,000, 3rd yr. \$19,000, 4th yr. \$19,000 and 5th yr. \$7,966.67.

Motion was made by Lansing and seconded by Wheeler to accept the tourism grant.

Chief Byrd explained to the board that Soddy Daisy donated 3 spike strips to the Police Department. He said that, if you were chasing someone or if another law enforcement was seeking help in a chase that the strips could flatten the tires in a safer means of getting them stopped. In order to use these must have training and an update to the police policy section on the use of spike strips.

Motion was made by Wheeler and seconded by Humble to approve the above said update to the City of Pikeville Police Policy.

In other business:

*Agreed to pay Thomas Bros. \$100,000 on paving loan of Main Street, Sells to By-Pass

*Try to fix some other areas such as Rockfort Road, Main Street entrances off side streets

*Ask State to fix Save-A-Lot entrance

There being no further business, motion to adjourn was made by Lansing and seconded by Humble. Voting, all YES.
