A copy of the previous regular meeting minutes was given to each member of the board and after reviewing; motion to approve as distributed was made by Anderson and seconded by Wheeler.

Mr. Hale with the Local Food Bank located on Cumberland Ave. addressed the board about concerns on traffic safety. He said that, the food bank would have up to 55 to 75 family's picking up food on Thursday's from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Due to limited parking in the area, it had become a safety issue for everyone and also loading the food.

Mayor Cagle expressed his concern if the street was closed emergency personnel would not be able to access the properties on Church Street if there was an emergency. He also said that, the entrance to his property was on Church Street beside the Food Bank.

After discussing several other options and locations nothing at this time seemed to be accessible.

Motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Humble to close a portion of Church Street from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. for two months as a trial period .

Matt Boynton addressed the board and presented an Improvements and Maintenance report on behalf of the BCYB. In the report was a bid estimate for new lighting fixtures, additional materials for lights, wire, underground boxes and misc. material for a cost of \$62,688.50 dollars. The city received a \$28,542.66 check from the insurance company on damages that had occurred at the park. It was noted that \$20,000 was for lighting. The rest of the money on the other repairs. BCYB was asking the city if they could make up the difference of \$6,382.56 or \$14,925.22 if they could not use the whole check amount on lighting.

The mayor and board members discussed that they would like for BYCB to request funds from the county since the city covers all the expenses on the park. The park is used by city and county residents and should be funded by both.

Motion was made by Lansing and seconded by Anderson to table the request until BCYB could address the county.

Motion to approve moving \$3,486.84 of utility debt from active status to inactive status for collection and also approve the utility adjustments.
