A copy of the previous minutes was given to each member of the board and after reviewing; motion to approve as distributed was made by Anderson and seconded by Lansing.

Motion to approve moving \$1,543.17 of utility debt from active status to inactive status for collection and also approve the utility adjustments was made by Wheeler and seconded by Lansing.

Mayor Cagle, introduced the following resolution explaining that, the property where Textiles of America/Whorisky Inc., (the old DURA Building) was bid back to the city at the tax sale on 9/5/25 for the City and County jointly for the taxes owed \$796,287.47 from 2020 to 2023. The city's portion is \$227,044.78 dollars. The tax amount has to be paid by March 23, 2026 to the Clerk and Master. The property is owned jointly 50/50 by the city and county and when the property is sold the proceed would be 50/50 split to each entity, he said.

Mayor Cagle preceded to explain that the Clerk and Master would write a check back to the city April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 26 deducting the fees and advertising cost. After speaking with the comptroller, they said that, we could do the following interfund capital outlay resolution and when the city received funds from the clerk and master could pay the interfund back.
